



Blyde Adventure Camp has been providing various adventure activities for more than 12 years to the youth travel industry. We pride ourselves on our high safety standards and record.

All activities (land and water based) at the Blyde Adventure Camp is supervised by our own staff who have years of experience in running adventure based experiential learning experiences for children and adults. 

Below is a complete list of activities run both on and off site by Blyde Adventure Camp. Descriptions of activities are given where the activity listed is not a recognized school sport.

- 1. Volley ball
- 2. Soccer
- 3. Touch/Tag Rugby
- 4. Frisbee
- 5. Lawn games (non physical and non contact) presented in open air facility
- 6. Lawn games (physical and contact) presented in open air facility
- 7. Team building games (non contact and non physical) presented in open air facility or in a covered lapa. Requires participants to write, observe, comment and build table top puzzles/challenges
- 8. Team building games (physical and contact) presented in open air facility and/or under a covered lapa. Requires participants to run, climb (max 1m), crawl, carry, pull, push, throw, balance.

- 11. Hiking: (5km+) up to 800m elevation gain and loss, steep terrain, uneven ground. Not a Big Five area.
- 12. Swimming: (river) depth from 0,2-2,5m, flowing current. Weak and non swimmers are provided with and required to use pfd's (personal flotation device). Annual screening tests are done for both water quality and aquatic parasites such as Schistosomiasis (bilarhzia).
- 13. Snorkeling: (NOT SCUBA DIVING) in the river. Maximum depth 1.5m. Annual screening tests are done for both water quality and aquatic parasites such as Schistosomiasis {bilarhzia}.
- 14. Bush Survival: identification of plants, animals, basic bush craft i.e. shelter, food, water, direction, survival skills.
- 15. River Ecology: (use of mini-SASS system for stream health). Requires participants to wade in shallow water, slow current in order to collect aquatic macro-invertebrates.
- 16. Obstacle course: (400m, 1.2km, 2.5km,5km,and 10km) requires participants to climb, crawl, run, jump, pull, push, carry, balance, throw, pick up and drag.

- 17. Paintball: Played with kati's/slingshots and industry standard recreational paintballs. Participants are in teams and shoot each other with the paintballs. Participants are supplied with

- 19. Archery target shooting (junior bows 8lb&10lb bows): Participants shoot blunt tip arrows (practice arrows) at stationary targets over distances of 5-20m.
- 20. River crossing: Two static ropes suspended above the water, participants walk on the bottom and hold onto the top rope in order to cross the river. Participants land in the water if they fall off. Distance between participant and surface min 5-60cm, weak or non swimmer participants are provided with and required to use a pfd. Facilitator is in an inflatable raft to assist participants who fall into the river.)
- 21. Tarzan swing: Participants swing on a rope into the river. Depth 1.7-2.5m weak or non-swimming participants are given a pfd, facilitator present to assist participants who struggle.
- 22. Geckoeing/River Tubing: Participants use Ark Gecko tubes {specialized river craft} to navigate a +-350m section of river. Includes 3 sets of easy rapids {Grade 1-2}. Participants are fitted with and required to use industry standard helmets and pfd's. Participants are accompanied by min 3 guides on the river.
- 23. Sleep out in the open air bush camp: Participants sleep outside in the open veldt, this is in a fenced off area. Some antelope {bushbuck, kudu, impala, and duiker} and small mammals present.
- 24. Stalk the lantern: A game played in the evening. Participants are taken to a field where they have to slowly and quietly approach a light beacon to get as close to the beacon as possible. Participants are required to walk, crouch and stand still.
- 25. Night Line: Evening game. Participants are taken to a cut pathway in the bush. There is a rope running the length of the pathway. Participants are lined up next to the rope so that they can hold onto the rope and each other. After this they are blindfolded and have to slowly follow the rope along the length of the pathway.
- 26. Blanket Nukem: A volley ball style game where participants are paired two by two. Using a blanket or towel the participants catch and throw a volley ball over a volley ball net.
- 27. Invasive plant control/monitoring: Groups participate in clearing out of alien invasive plants in the forest.

 Participants supply their own PPE (gloves) and assist by removing and counting young invasive plants such as

 Lantana Camara and syringa Melia azedarach.
- 28. Cooking competitions: Participants cook "potjiekos" over an open fire. Participants are supplied with ingredients, standard kitchen utensils and a no3 three legged cast iron pot. With which they cook over an open fire. Participants cook "stick bread" over an open fire. Participants are supplied with dough and a 1,5m long reed. The dough is wrapped around the reed and then cooked over open coals.

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
